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| You have to use the clues to work out what the answer might be and you need |
| to use evidence from the text to support your answer and opinions. |
| You need to use an APE answer for this type of question. |
| You can find the APE comprehension answer sheets on the school website in |
| the 'Reading' Tab on the right-hand side of the Home Learning section. |
| You have to think about the word that has been used and work out the meaning |
| of the word in the context it's given. |
| You need to think about words which have a similar meaning (synonyms) and |
| words which have an opposite meaning (antonyms). |
| You might be given alternative words to choose from so you need to try each of |
| these in the sentence to check if it makes sense |
| You have to think about what has already happened in the story. |
| You have to consider the characters and think about what possible things they |
| might say or do. |
| You have to make sure that your prediction links in to the 'time' of the story e.g. |
| a story set in Victorian Times would not feature an X Box. |
| You need to have taken in the words that you have read in the story so that you |
| have put the events into your mind and can recall them in order. |
| ➤ When you've answered a sequence question, you need to check your answers |
| are in the right order by reading the events in the order you have put them. |
| You need to be able to explain what a word means in order to give reasons |
| why the author has chosen to use it. |
| You need to think about why authors use words and phrases e.g. to make us |
| picture the scene more vividly, to create a scary atmosphere, to make the |
| reader feel happy, to compare the character to something else so that we can |
| picture what they are like etc. |
