Not all of the questions were used in the worksheet, so ignore any answers that you didn't have questions for!

### Developing

1a. The film – out yesterday – was very funny.

2a. The puppy – only 10 weeks old – was going to a new home.

3a. He had wrapped a lot of presents – 15 in total!

4a. True

5a. Mrs Smith – our new teacher – gave us extra playtime for behaving so well.

6a. A large sum of money – over £1,000,000 – was won by a family of seven and they gave half to charity.

7a. Thankfully, his mother said that he could go to his best friend's party – weather permitting – as long as he was back by midnight.

8a. True

### Greater Depth

9a. To stop the build-up of traffic, the police man – who had just arrived – took charge and began to redirect the buses and lorries.

10a. Last week, a break-in occurred at night – 1am to be precise – but the police still have no real clues.

11a. Jumping ahead of the line, the child couldn't wait to ice-skate his way around the rink at the newly built leisure park – it had only opened today and everyone was really excited to see it.

1b. Jasper – the boy next door – was lovely.

2b. My coffee – bought only 5 minutes ago – is stone cold!

3b. It had happened so many years ago – 20 years ago in fact.

4a. False – there is no parenthesis.

### Expected

5a. I love peas – except the mushy sort – but I don't like pea soup!

6a. After thinking for a while – 10 whole minutes to be precise – Dad decided that his answer was no and was not willing to change his mind.

7a. Finally, his luck had changed and the expensive mountain bike was reduced in the sale – only £150!

8a. False – there is no parenthesis.

### Greater Depth

9a. To keep up-to-date with new ideas, the pupil – aged 10 – read books avidly and often recommended those he loved to his friends.

10a. The state-of-the-art device is going on display – as of next week – so everyone will have a chance to view it.

11a. Deviously, the dragon decided to booby-trap his entire cave in case someone attempted to steal his precious gold – it had happened before!

12a. True – the new girl in our class – needs dashes for parenthesis.

### Developing

1a. Various answers; for example: Our house – the white one with the red door – is just down the road from yours.

2a. I love to eat peppers with my salad – only the red ones though.

3a. Jasmine is incorrect. It should be: The tree – which had stood for over 100 years – had been blown over by the storm.

### Expected

4a. Various answers; for example: The clock tower – built in 1829 – was destroyed last night by a massive bolt of lightning and will need to be restored.

5a. Just now, I was quite surprised to see my dad holding a rather large spider and carrying it carefully outside – albeit reluctantly.

6a. Jodie is incorrect. It should be: Trembling with fear, the girl peered through the darkness – caused by the broken streetlamp – in hope of seeing her father as she had not seen him in such a long time.

7b. Various answers; for example: Yesterday, the world-famous astronaut – Sasha Crabapple from Essex – broke yet another record after completing a five year mission in the deepest, darkest depths of outer space.

8b. For Christmas, the high-tech toy of the year is a walking, talking robot which is capable of tidying your room and completing all of your homework tasks – batteries not included.
