### WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?



Lily has whistled over to Robert, who hears her, looks up and answers her. She comes down to the front of the house and they have a conversation about what has been going on.

What do they say to each other?

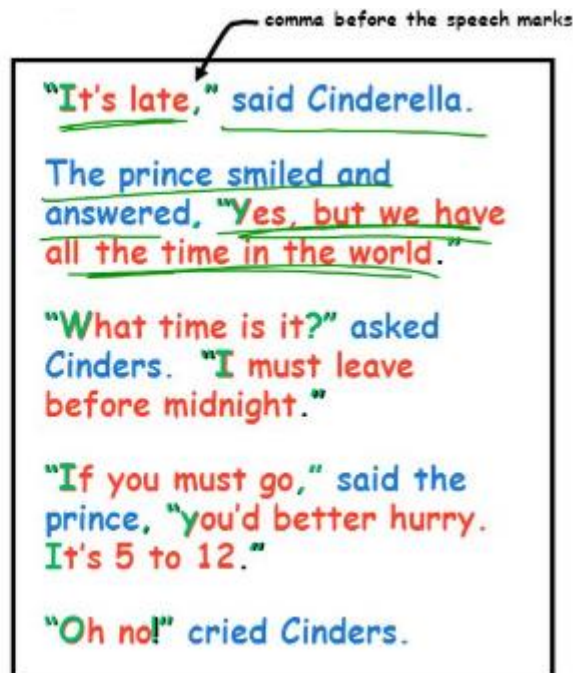
Does Lily trust him enough to confide in him?

Does Robert feel he can tell Lily his thoughts without getting into trouble?

Use accurate speech punctuation to write out the conversation that they have. Remember to use a mixture of speech verbs, not just 'said' and to use some adverbial phrases with 'said' to add more detail about how the speaker is feeling.

Accurate speech punctuation:

- \* Each new speaker on a new line.
- \* Speech marks (" ") round the **direct speech**.
- \* Comma between **direct speech** and **reporting clause**...
- \* ...unless there's a ? or !
- \* **Direct speech** begins with a capital letter...
- \* ...unless a sentence is interrupted by the **reporting clause**.



### Adverbials examples

- with a worried look upon her face
- with a tremble in his voice
- whilst looking around suspiciously
- leaning forwards so as not to be heard
- not wanting Madame Verdigris to hear what she was saying.
