Step 1: Consolidating Determiners

Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain whether a given statement about a determiner is correct or not, using an article as a determiner.

Expected Explain whether a given statement about a determiner is correct or not, using a possessive/demonstrative determiner.

Greater Depth Explain whether a given statement about a determiner is correct or not, using a quantifying/possessive determiner.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Application)

Developing Use two given determiners (articles as determiners) and a given word bank to create two sentences.

Expected Use three given determiners (possessive, demonstrative, numerical) and a given word bank to create three sentences.

Greater Depth Use three given determiners (interrogative, quantifying, demonstrative) and a given word bank to create three sentences.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain whether the identified article as a determiner is the most appropriate one in a given sentence.

Expected Explain whether the identified numerical determiner is the most appropriate one in a given sentence.

Greater Depth Explain whether the identified interrogative determiner is the most appropriate one in a given sentence.

Application and Reasoning Consolidating Determiners

Developing

- 1a. No, the article being used as a determiner is 'the'.
- 2a. Various possible answers, for example: In school the boy loved to read books. The girl took an apple to school as a snack. School is a good place for boys and girls to learn.
- 3a. No, the determiner should be 'an' because 'oven' starts with a vowel sound.

Expected

- 4a. No, the possessive determiner is 'your'.
- 5a. Various possible answers, for example: He rode his red bike all the way to the park. "This road will take us all the way to the next house," explained Alisha. Only one bike is working properly, as the others all have a puncture.
- 6a. No, a possessive determiner such as 'his' or 'her' would be more appropriate.

Greater Depth

- 7a. No, the quantifying determiner is 'whole'.
- 8a. Various answers, for example: "Which lake is that in the distance?" I asked as we glimpsed it from the top of a hill. "This hill is too steep for us to hike over it," I exclaimed. I was getting worried as we didn't have any food or water left and we were still miles from home.
- 9a. No, the interrogative determiner should be 'Which'.

Application and Reasoning Consolidating Determiners

Developing

- 1b. No, the article being used as a determiner is 'an'.
- 2b. Various possible answers, for example: Kim was hungry so she had an egg sandwich. Sam doesn't like the beans to cover his egg. A healthy snack is beans on toast.
- 3b. No, it should be 'the' because 'toast' cannot be counted so it has to have the definite article as the determiner.

Expected

- 4b. No, the demonstrative determiner is 'that'.
- 5b. Various possible answers, for example: Two weeks ago my dad bought me a new black coat for school. I love my coat as it keeps me really warm. I hoped he would buy that one for me.
- 6b. No, a possessive determiner such as 'our' would be more appropriate.

Greater Depth

- 7b. No, the possessive determiner is 'their'.
- 8b. Various answers, for example: Your friends really enjoyed themselves at your party. It was a disaster when the whole cake dropped on the floor. "What party?" I asked, bemused.
- 9b. No, the interrogative determiner should be 'What'.
