

But now I saw something else. There, in the distance, was a line of cliffs.


"Elzivir," I shouted, "those cliffs... We're in Moonfleet Bay!"

There were rocks everywhere and the storm was getting worse. The other prisoners were wild with fear. But, gradually, the ship began to turn.






How to Draw a Self-Portrait
Step 2


Make some very faint guide lines with a pencil and ruler.




How to Draw a Self-Portrait Step 4




