Plot: Stig of the Dump is a classic story book about when two boys, who are complete opposites of each other, become friends.

It all starts when Barney goes down the chalk pit, where everyone tells him not to go, to find a little dilapidated, scruffy hut. That was not the only thing; he also found a man. But not just an ordinary man, no! A cave man named Stig. The story is all about how Stig and Barney's friendship blossoms with a few bumps on the way. It's also about the adventures they get into. These include hunting hounds, stopping robbers, decorating Stig's house and many, many more.

Themes: unusual friendships, loyalty, bravery.

Setting: When author, Clive King, was young his family moved to a village called Ash, near Sevenoaks in Kent, which is the setting for Stig of the Dump.

CHARACTERS


Barney – an ordinary boy who helps the reader empathise and imagine what it would be like if the events of the story were to happen to them. Barney has a sense of adventure and can be mischievous.

Stig – a stone age man who lives in the 'dump'

inside the chalk pit. Stig is ingenious, making tools out of rubbish. He is kind and loyal to Barney.

Lou – Barney's elder sister. Although she is a good sister she spends much of the story not believing in Stig.

The Snargets – three boys who come from the poor end of town. At the start of the story the boys do not get on with barney but over time they realise they have common interests.

Chall	k pit	A quarry from which chalk is extracted. A place, typically a large, deep pit, from which stone or other materials are or have been extracted.
Old m	an's beard	A large lichen that forms shaggy greyish growths on the branches of trees.
Stone	e Age	A prehistoric period when weapons and tools were made of stone or of organic materials such as bone, wood, or horn.

Flint		A hard grey rock consisting of nearly pure silica (chert), occurring chiefly as nodules in chalk.
